To be a Saint – Signs – Part 2, The Healing of the Official's Son

Prelude - After the miracle of the Cana wedding feast, Jesus, along with his mother and disciples, traveled to Capernaum on the north coast of the Sea of Galilee, located a few miles east of Cana. From there he travelled to Jerusalem some 85 miles to the south, in Judea, for the Jewish Passover. It is here that Jesus chased the money lenders from the temple and overturned their tables. Jesus would have been known in the Temple from earlier visits. Some may have been well aware of the earlier prophesy of Simeon.

Surly word of Jesus' first sign in Cana had spread throughout Judea and the city. It was during this visit that Jesus first met Nicodemus who was a Pharisee and a member of the Jewish Sanhedrin. Nicodemus, struggling to understand who Jesus was, came under the cover of darkness to talk to Jesus. It is not recorded what Nicodemus' thoughts were after their conversations, however he would turn out to be one of the few allies Jesus would have in the Sanhedrin.

After Passover, Jesus traveled once again to Galilee through Samaria, a region occupied by descendants of Jacob, but had become intermixed with gentiles. They were viewed with suspicion and enmity by orthodox Jews. Jesus stopped around noon at the city called Sychar, by the well of Jacob. There He met and spoke to the Samaritan woman and revealed Himself to be the Christ. John does not record any great sign while Jesus stayed in Samaria, however many Samaritans believed Jesus' words and Jesus stayed there two days before traveling on.

The second sign - The word of Jesus' return must have travelled quickly to Galilee. The Rabbi who had made water into wine, the one who had cleansed the Temple. The one who lingered among the Samaritans so long. Who was this man? So many wanting to catch a glimpse of the great rabbi. So many wishing to speak to Him and have Him perform another sign.

Among those who sought to see Jesus when he returned to Cana was an "Official", someone of rank, possibly within the administration of King Herod who had jurisdiction over the region. As the official's son was near death, John tells us that he begged Jesus to come to Capernaum and heal his son.

As He did at the wedding feast, Jesus does not immediately agree to the official's request, but seemingly rebukes him, and those standing nearby, saying, "...Unless you see signs and wonders, you will not believe.", John 4:48. This is interesting. Contrast that with Jesus' time among the Samaritans, where many came to believe without physical signs and wonders.

The official persisted. This action is important. After Jesus' rebuke, some would have become discouraged and walked away. Some would have tried to counter Jesus' statement with flattery, so He would agree to come. Some may have even become angry and sought to bring ridicule. The Official only persisted and now asked Jesus to come to his child before he dies. This time he did not ask for the healing, merely the visit. Jesus' response? "Go, your son will live." There is fruit here. Do I approach the Lord as some type of magical genie in a bottle to grant my wish, or do I humble myself and persevere in my prayers, patiently waiting for God's answer?

Jesus spoke these words at the 7th hour. That would have been about 1pm. Sixteen miles away in Capernaum lay the official's son. Still a lot of daylight for travel. Indeed, if Jesus had agreed to come, presumably the official would have departed as soon as possible. Yet, he did not immediately return. John does not give us the reason except to say that the man believed Jesus and went his way. As we are to hear later in John's Gospel, "...Blessed are those who have not seen, and yet believe." John 20:29.

The official traveled home the next day where he met his servant coming from Capernaum to tell him his son was cured. The official asked when his son recovered, and the servant said specifically it was the day before at the 7th hour, the exact hour when Jesus had told him his son would live. Distance and time are no barriers to the power of God's love and mercy.

Our Lord's sign did far more than cure the official's son, it was also the means by which faith was further spread throughout the official's family and the region. Who was this man Jesus? Was he a great prophet. Could he be the promised one?

Christ's power works mightily even unto this day in those who believe yet have not seen.

Nothing but a Number

Japanese mountain climber Yuichiro Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. Naval officer Grace Hopper became the first female rear admiral of the United States Navy when she was 79. Margaret Haggerty completed her quest to run a marathon on each of the seven continents when she was 84.

If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.

That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.

Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.

In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultra-experienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.

Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?
