To be a Saint – The Assumption

"Arise O Lord into your resting place: you and the ark, which you have sanctified." Ps. 132:8

It is mid-August, a time for vacations, picnic's, all sorts of outdoor activities and travel. The high holydays of Easter are behind us, and Christmas and the Nativity are as far away as the thought of the first snowfall. It is here, at this point in the calendar, that Holy Church has given us a great feast day to contemplate the Blessed Virgin Mary's Assumption, and indeed our own journey toward Heaven. It has become a national holiday in over 40 countries and is celebrated by Catholics, Orthodox and yes, even in some fashion by several protestant denominations.

On August 15th we commemorate the translation of Mary, body and soul, to heaven. No, it is not directly addressed in scripture. There are many passages that have been attributed to Mary. Chapter 12 of the Book of Revelations almost certainly deals with the Blessed Virgin Mary, and there are other biblical passages, such as Genesis 3:15 and the one quoted above, that have been interpreted as referring to the Blessed Virgin. Still, no Assumption or Dormition is mentioned. None-the-less, the Assumption is part of Apostolic Tradition. Indeed, from the earliest days of Christianity, the Assumption was taken as a matter of fact. It was not until 1950, during the Pontificate of Pope Pius XII, that the Assumption was formerly considered dogma of the faith.

Skeptical? Since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus' life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe in Mary's share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him body and soul in heaven. It is not unreasonable to think that Mary, referred to as the "New Eve" since apostolic times, experienced a translation that would have been enjoyed by the first Eve, absent original sin.

Bordering on mania, even fanaticism, saintly relics have always been highly prized in the church, especially in the early church. Consider, no relics of Mary were ever put forth. At the council of Chalcedon in 451, the Roman Emperor Marcian asked the Patriarch of Jerusalem to bring relics of the Virgin Mary. The patriarch told the emperor that there were no relics, and that although Mary died in the presence of the Apostles, her tomb was opened later and found empty. The apostles concluded that the body was taken up into Heaven. Another story from the visionary, Blessed Ann Emmerich, has it that the tomb was opened at the request of Saint Thomas. It seems our good friend was absent again, away on missionary work, and could not get back in time to be by Mary's side when she died. The case remains that no relics of the Blessed Virgin has ever been made known.

Is it still so incredible to believe that the Blessed Virgin was assumed into Heaven? In Luke 1:28, the Angel says "Hail full of Grace" in his greeting to Mary. Mary was indeed the most perfect creature ever created. She was born without the stain of original sin. She was given graces by God unique to all of mankind. She kept her virginity during childbirth. She bore the Son of God; the second person of the Holy Trinity. She led an exemplary and pure life. She had a relationship with Jesus like no other. Is it any wonder that Jesus would want her in heaven body and soul? In the words of Saint John Damascus, "It is fitting that God's mother should possess what belongs to her Son, and that she should be honored by every creature as the mother and handmaid of God." Every creature, including Satan. Think now the long played out plan of God accomplished, and the crushing defeat that Satan felt when he saw the Blessed Virgin assumed into heaven, body and soul.

In Marion visions over time, and around the world, Mary, who radiates the splendor and glory of heaven, is always depicted as being most beautiful and pure. She reflects the Glory that is God. For those that are saved, we will share that experience as well. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that every spiritual soul "is immortal: It does not perish when it separates from the body at death, and it will be reunited with the body at the final Resurrection" (CCC366). Indeed, in the Apostles Creed we proclaim "I believe in the resurrection of the body."

So, what does resurrection of the body mean? It means to come back to life again. We do not say resurrection of the soul, for the soul does not die. The soul is immortal; only the body dies. On the last day, our body will come back to life again, and will be reunited to our soul. Only this time our body will have immortality. We will not be subject to age or the ravishes of time. There will be a certain perfection. Similar to the perfection seen during Marion Visions. Like Mary, our bodies will reflect the glory that is God according to his plan. We may not shine as bright as the Blessed Virgin, the Mother of God, and heaven's greatest saint, but we take on an appearance and countenance greater than anything we could possible imagine.

This is the destiny that awaits the children of God.

Nothing but a Number

Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. Naval officer Grace Hopper became the first female rear admiral of the United States Navy when she was 79. Margaret Haggerty completed her quest to run a marathon on each of the seven continents when she was 84.

If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.

That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.

Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.

In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultraexperienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.

Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?
