## Our Daily Bread – The Importance of Christian Moral Values

We live a life of continual change and advancements in our technology. From an early age we are taught to accept it, as a modern society we rush to it and embrace it. We have gotten so use to the pace of advancement in our technology, that we sometimes grow impatient for the next new device or app. We want that new car or medical procedure that promises so much. We want our technology and we want it now...

These days technology is changing faster than ever. It was not always so. Take a look at a technology time-scale, and you will see that historically changes in technology were infrequent. We plodded along in more or less a linear progression for centuries. About the time of the enlightenment and the industrial revolution, we started to see amazing progress. Machines of all types were being devised and built to ease our labor and educate us. Advancements to the original printing press put knowledge within every man's reach, the steam engine, followed by the eternal combustion engine, moved us and our goods over land, on the water, and through the air. The telegraph followed by the telephone, the radio and so on, connected the world like never before. We eventually devised machines that did our calculations and stored the wealth of human knowledge, so that anyone could access it. All this progress jammed into such a small amount of time of say 300 years. Technology is slowly allowing us to overpower the natural world. Along the way man develop an amazingly comfortable lifestyle, something our forebears could have never dreamt of, and we are taking much of it for granted.

But it does not stop there. Fueled by a seemingly endless supply of money, technology is no longer plodding along in a simple lineal progression. It is expanding exponentially. Each succeeding year we develop our technology further in multiple areas. We live in the age of super computers which allow us to instantly communicate and run our business and finances. Wealth is created and sometimes lost in a wink of an eye. We are making our machines "intelligent" (AI), giving them the power to reason and act independently of human control. We are manipulating DNA to clone animals, even developing ways to resurrect extinct species or create new ones. Some advocate melding humans with machines, so that the individual would achieve some type of immortality. Some feel they are on the verge of even creating life. There's more, but you take my meaning.

And that brings me to my point. In the drive for technological development are we neglecting our Christian moral values? Is our technology serving mankind, or something else? Do we truly understand the consequences of our appetite for technological change? Are we in love with our own power, or do we trust and hold in awe the power of God?

Traditional Christian moral values have up to recent times always been the yard stick whereby we measure and rectify our actions. A guide post based on God's laws and developed independently of our technology and advancements. Application of this set of moral values has been noticeably absent in recent times. In its place, we are developing a set of modern moral values. These are self-serving values that are being developed alongside, and in support of, our technological pursuits. This new moral code comes under the general heading of "In service to mankind", and as a society we feel justified.

The decline in the application of our traditional Christian moral values is felt in other areas. Look at how the definition of a traditional family is being changed to suit perversion. Consider the growing abuse of vulnerable children, who are trafficked to suit the same type of perversion. Even our understanding of male and female is being turned on its head. I'll say it again, are there really 72 genders? Are we seeing the mantra of "In service to

mankind", morphing into "Man's will over God's"?

History is the most reliable path to understanding the present and identifying the problems of the future. In my early readings I came across the writings of Will Durant, a 20<sup>th</sup> century historian. In his summary he makes the following statement, "A great civilization is not conquered from without until it has destroyed itself within.... There is no significant example in history, before our time, of a society successfully maintaining moral life without the aid of religion" (Will Durant, *The Lessons of History*). T.S. Eliot and Arnold Toynbee had similar views. Even George Washington said religion and morality are "indispensable support" for the survival of a nation.

We may not be able to change the present course of western civilization, but there are still some refuges and bastions of traditional Christian morality. We do have the power to act individually, within the family, our parishes and our local community to build strong Christian moral values, and not succumb to the modern values of the world. In this, never underestimate the power of God's plan; for indeed there is one, and in the end, His Will be done.

## *Nothing but a Number*

*Japanese mountain climber Yuichiro Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. Naval officer Grace Hopper became the first female rear admiral of the United States Navy when she was 79. Margaret Haggerty completed her quest to run a marathon on each of the seven continents when she was 84.*

*If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.*

*That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.*

*Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.*

*In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultra-experienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.*

*Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?*
