Our Daily Bread – Not By Accident

Sometimes they come at our choosing, and other times not, but no one comes into your life by accident. And yes, I believe that sometimes God sends people into our life for a purpose. How ever they come, we are influenced and changed in some way. We may be influenced toward a better understanding and living of life, or influenced toward the vices and frame of mind that destroys our life, or something in between. Some of these individuals become our great supporters and advocates. Others seemingly come to challenge everything we do, and seek to undermine. We can learn from all.

Before receiving my commission, I was a young petty officer working at a Marine Safety Office. Although I suffered a bit in an office environment, my work kept me on the water in some fashion as a facility inspector and boat coxswain. Mom and I had just met and were dating. The work was easy, I had my girl, and life was just fine...... Well, you know what comes next......

Someone up the chain of command saw some talent in me, and I was assigned as one of the service's first enlisted maritime investigating officers. I wore civilian clothes and investigated maritime accidents, explosions, injuries and deaths, etc... Our office also prosecuted offenders holding maritime licenses before the local Administrative Law Judge, and did maritime licensing work. The job required certain skill sets, including good language and writing skills. Well, it did not take me long to realize that I had neither.

My investigative reports were invariably rejected, sent back with so much marking on them I simply could not decipher the meaning. When I went to ask for clarification, I would get chewed up and spit out. In the field, meetings, interviews and inquiries were difficult. The way things were, there was no way I was going to be allowed anywhere near a court room environment. In short, I was failing at this job, miserably. The Executive Officer became the focal point, or rather the wall that was keeping me from completing anything. He was merciless in his criticism. A senior commissioned officer, it may have been because he did not agree with the enlisted investigator program, but in reality, he was right in his criticism and rejection of my work.

One day, after another tail chewing by the XO, I remember seeing a big dictionary on his desk. It was a blue, New World College, second edition. I also saw a Collins Thesaurus. I went out the same day and bought that dictionary and later the Thesaurus. I began to look up words at night. Words I would hear or read in some report, and did not fully understand. I learned how to use the Thesaurus. I began to read everything I could get my hands on. Encyclopedias were a favorite. I always was enrolled in two or three service courses. Mom would help me study in the evenings by asking me questions from the course book. I worked hard to assemble my thoughts before I spoke, putting a lot of effort in organization and structure. Probably the best thing that happened is that I picked up a mentor, a young lieutenant about my own age. He showed me how to assemble a report, how to be logical and concise in my writing. Later, he also pushed me toward applying for an officer's commission.

Anyway, ever so slowly, my work began to move through the XO's office. When work came back marked up, it was easy to fix. One day I was even ready to go into the XOs office and professionally defend my report, down to every fact, every conclusion and recommendation. I began to be called in frequently to brief the Commanding Officer on ongoing cases, incidents and threats. I was asked for my opinion and recommendations. I was trusted.

No, I never became a great orator or writer. I still have so many faults I can barely stand to read my own writing, and I have an absolute dread of hearing my voice. I did become good enough to do my work, and the work that would come to me throughout my career. What would have

happened if I had not been put through that experience at the Marine Safety Office?

Looking back on it all, I can see clearly how each of the individuals mentioned above shaped my life. Each one played a role. One to bring home to me the stark reality of my weakness. One to teach and guide me along. One (mom) to be there beside me no matter what happened, win or lose. She's still there, and I rely on that.

You know I still have that old blue dictionary. It is well worn and thumbed through, just like my bible. I am reluctant to throw out tools that have served me so well. Love Dad

On Piroshki: Nothing brings us together quite like food. Nothing brings back stronger memories of our childhood and family then the dishes we ate sitting around the supper table in our youth. The taste, the smell, the look, all create an ambiance that brings us comfort and joy. This is a gift from God..

Over the years Ascension has developed recipes and worked hard to keep alive traditions that go back to its Eastern European roots. Pierogi, Kielbasa, Halushki, Halupke, Kolache, and now we are proud to introduce a new item to our Eastern European fare, Piroshki. Well, maybe new to the parish, but not exactly new in its history. Piroshki goes back at least 1000 years. They were documented as being served in Medieval Kyiv. They are small little pies filled with a combination of meat, vegetables, rice or whatever might be at hand. They are either made with leavened or unleavened bread and are fried or baked until golden brown.

Here in the Kitchen, we are still working out the details on production scheduling and packaging. In God's good time we think we will have another product worthy of the Ascension label, and something to be enjoyed with your family gathered around your own supper table to create those special lifetime memories.

Nothing but a Number

Japanese mountain climber Yuichiro Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.

That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.

Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.

In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultraexperienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.

Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?
