Our Daily Bread – Don't Be Part of the Crowd

Group think can be dangerous. Group think in a crowd can be disastrous.

When the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the Israelites became anxious and told Aaron to fashion a false god for them to worship. So, Aaron, the right-hand man of Moses, took their golden rings and other golden objects, and fashioned a golden calf. Yep, the same folks who had just been delivered from Egypt, watched the parting of the Red Sea and then watched Pharaoh's Army be destroyed, these same people set up a false god to worship while Moses received the Ten Commandments from God.

Barely a week after the Jewish crowds welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem, hailing Him as the King, the Sanhedrin brought Jesus before Pontius Pilate. Late in the trial, Pilate sought a way to free Jesus. It was a Passover festival custom that the governor releases a prisoner to the people, so Pilate allowed them to choose between a convicted criminal and revolutionary named Barabbas and Jesus. As related in Mark 15:11, the Chief Priests stirred up the crowd to ask for the release of Barabbas. Of course, in order for God's plan of salvation to be accomplished this had to come to pass, but notice how quickly moods can change (or more properly be swayed).

There are more examples within the bible, but let's look into our own culture. Look at the lynchings in the south during the reconstruction years. Consider the acceptance of the internment of all Japanese civilians after Pearl Harbor. Usually, it is a mistake to apply our moral standards against the standards of a previous age, but wrong is wrong in any age.

What causes this type of group think? I would say fear is the number one cause. An unwillingness to stand apart from the crowd and risk being singled out. A secondary cause is laziness in not wanting to do the work necessary to form your own opinion, and then the courage to stand by it. Like a child dependent on their parents for guidance, we tend to feel comfortable in setting someone up in authority to tell us what to do. There is another aspect to this; that of agenda and control. This phenomenon is studied extensively in war colleges and government, and bet your bottom dollar it is leveraged in order to achieve control and predicted outcomes.

There is also professional group-think. A quick example is the procedure of bloodletting that was practiced from ancient times right up to the beginnings of our Nation. In fact, it was the primary cause of the death of George Washington, as attending physicians basically drained his blood in order to improve his "humors".

What causes this type of professional group think? I would say the same, fear. Fear of professional bullying, intimidation and the perceived need to conform. It's risky

professionally to question too much. To offer a different opinion. Don't misunderstand, there are some brilliant professionals, men and women who are intelligent and sharp. They each have a professional choice to make. Some will stand up for their opinions but many others will not question, or risk losing their standing, their position, their source of funding within the professional community.

Dad, where are you going here?

The importance of critical, individual thought is essential to finding the right course for you and your family. It is why God gave you that intellect. It takes a certain amount of effort to do the homework necessary to find the truth, and then the courage to stand for your belief. To many folks are too willing to listen to someone else, trust someone in authority on how to think, what to do. It takes no effort, no courage and ensures you will not be singled out or ostracized. It also leads to the disastrous group think which we talked about.

So, Dad, do you really believe the Bible story of the parting of the Red Sea?

I do, both as a matter of faith and a matter of fact. Firstly, as a matter of faith. The Bible is the inspired word of God. If "they" can shake your faith in the story of the parting of the Red Sea, "they" will attempt to shake your faith in the rest. Some scientific communities will candidly tell you that Christ did not rise from the dead.... There's no prove. If you believe the Bible is the inspired Word of God. Then have faith in all of it.

Secondly, as a matter of fact. Here I am going to ask you to do some work. Look up and research Nuweiba Beach, located on the east side of the Sinai Peninsula on the Gulf of Aqaba. Look up the pillars of Solomon that were erected some 480 years after the crossing, to commemorate the event. Look at the topography of the sea floor in the area, the gentle grade that allowed the passage on foot. Look at the underwater photo's of the coral encrusted war chariots and implements of war strewn across that area of the sea floor, consistent with the army of Pharaoh from that time period. Go further, look up Jebel Al-Lawz in the ancient land of Median on the Saudi Arabian Peninsula, across from the Nuweiba Beach site. The mountain whose summit rocks are blackened on one side as if scorched from a great fire. Look at the evidence of the altar of worship at the foot of the mountain, the split rock which shows erosion from the gushing forth of water. Then read the bible in Exodus, in Numbers, in Kings and Deuteronomy. Read the commentary of the historians Josephus and Philo. Then form your own opinion.

To much work Dad. We'll take your word for it.....

Just so. If you care, do your homework. Form your own opinion. Then stand by it.

Nothing but a Number

Japanese mountain climber Yuichiro Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. Naval officer Grace Hopper became the first female rear admiral of the United States Navy when she was 79. Margaret Haggerty completed her quest to run a marathon on each of the seven continents when she was 84.

If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.

That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.

Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.

In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultra-experienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.

Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?

To Take Away
