## Our Daily Bread - Do You Believe?

Do Satanists really have a stronger belief in the Holy Eucharist than you? Read on..

We live in a time of great upheaval and change. A time where it becomes easy to lose your way. People will come forward, some of them familiar and trusted, and they will cry, "Follow Me, I know the way!" Or the cry will go forth, "Let's get together, and we will decide the right course. We will trust in the Spirit to move us...." They will make convincing arguments for those who are weak in their faith and have not taken the time to learn it.

I've spoken before about the necessity of a ship having an anchor and chain that will hold it fast in a storm, making an analogy to our journey of faith in this world. We need an anchor with a strong chain, to hold us fast in times of danger. We have that anchor and chain in a well-formed Catholic faith. In our Profession of Faith, the Nicene Creed, we define our anchor, we forge the links of the chain. First note that the Creed is a personal affirmation of faith. We use the words "I believe", not we believe. It is not group think that compels us to say these words. I say these words speaking for myself alone, motivated by a strong personal conviction of their truth. You should do the same.

Our anchor and its chain are fashioned strong by the teachings of Jesus, the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit, the traditions of the church fathers, the graces received from the sacraments and other sources. Even so, it comes under considerable attack in these modern, progressive times. Forces seek to weaken our faith, dilute it and cause us not to trust in it. Just like a ship's crew continually keep their anchor and chain in good working order, we also have to work to maintain our faith, understand it, and keep it in good repair. So, let's talk about one of the tenets of our faith. Something that identifies us as uniquely Catholic, yet has come into question and ambiguity.

"This is My body." and "This is My blood." These are the words the Priest recites during the consecration. It is the same in the west as it is the east. "Do this in memory of Me", that was the command Jesus gave the Apostles at the Last Supper. It is a tenet of our Catholic faith, the changing of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. But do we believe?

It's called Transubstantiation. A mouthful of letters for sure. It means the conversion of the substance of the Eucharistic elements of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ. But do we believe? Do we believe in miracles, for that is what takes place on the altar by the hands of the priest each Mass, each Divine Liturgy. During this action, the ordained priest on the altar is conformed to Christ and acts *In persona Christi*, a Latin phrase meaning "in the person of Christ". It is the priest that says the words, "This is My body", "This is My Blood." The hands of the priest have been consecrated so that whatever they bless may be blessed, whatever they consecrate may become holy and sacred in the name of the Lord Jesus. Only the ordained priest

can offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. I will have more to say on *In Persona Christi* in future.

Our belief in transubstantiation is defined in scripture in accounts of the last supper. See Matthew 26:26-28, Luke 22:17-23. See also 1 Cor 11:24. It is best remembered through the teachings of Jesus found in John 6:53-57. This then becomes a tenet of our faith and is set forth in the Catechism of the Roman Catholic Church in Section 1376. In the Eastern Churches, it is Canon 698.

But dad, the Protestants and even some churches that claim to be Catholic are saying Jesus was speaking figuratively, He meant it to be a memorial. He didn't really mean that surely.

These churches you speak of have lost the meaning. For them communion is symbolic only. Their focus is not on the mystical transformation of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ, but on the communal aspect of sharing a meal. They have failed to maintain their chain and the link holding their anchor has parted so that they become adrift.

Read on in John 6. Jesus' language indicates clearly that He was not speaking figuratively, or symbolically. He meant what He said. How do I know this? When there was grumbling and rejection of His statement, given in the synagogue of Capernaum, even when many of the disciples walked away and rejected Him, turned against Him, Jesus did not say "don't go away, I was only speaking figuratively. I only meant it as a symbol." No, Jesus meant what He said. I ask you again, do you believe?

I will tell you who does believe, Satanists. In order to conduct the rituals of their Black Mass they seek a consecrated host; one from a Catholic Church. They do not seek to desecrate the Eucharist from other faiths or denominations. Former Satanist Betty Brennan once said many Satanists and witches know the difference between a consecrated host and an unconsecrated host, being able to sense the presence of God in a consecrated host. She claims that if a thousand hosts were put on a table, the Satanist would be able to find the one that was consecrated.

So, do you believe? For if you do believe, and approach the Holy Eucharist reverently, with respect, and in a state of grace, then the other part of Jesus' statement at Capernaum will also hold true. ".....He who eats this bread will live forever."; John 6:58

## *Nothing but a Number*

*Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. *If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.*

*That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.*

*Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.*

*In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultra-experienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.*

*Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?*
