"Lord, teach us to pray" Luke 11:1

True Praying involves knowing beforehand what to request from God. Praying is asking for something definite. The mind is given over entirely to God, thinking of him, of what is needed, and of what has been received in the past.

The very first step in prayer is a mental step. We must be taught through our intellect. And only as far as the intellect is given over to God in prayer will be able to learn how to pray.

Lord Jesus, just like Your disciples long ago I ask of You today, "teach me (us) to pray." Amen.

To Be a Saint – Obedience to God Comes Before Obedience to Man

And when they had brought them, they set them before the council. And the high priest questioned them, saying, "We strictly charged you not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you intend to bring this man's blood upon us." But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men. The God of our fathers raised Jesus whom you killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior, to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him." When they heard this, they were enraged and wanted to kill them. Acts 5:27-33.

Our faith requires much. It goes without saying that we must never deny the truth of our faith out of fear of temporal authority. Each generation will face its challenges. Christians living in the 1st century Roman Empire were forbidden from preaching or practicing their faith. During this period, thousands became martyrs for the faith. There are more recent examples. Talk to anyone who lived under Soviet Communism, and they will tell you stories that would be hard to imagine for Americans who live in a free society. Talk to those who live in Communist China today. Their "Bishops" are selected and largely controlled by the Communist State. Most Catholics who seek to worship do so, hidden from government authorities. The conditions in North Korea are extreme. Changchung Cathedral is the nominal cathedral of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Pyongyang, and is strictly controlled by government authorities. There are rumored to be several catholic communities within North Korea, but all operate in hiding. I could not begin to tell you how any Catholic clergy living in North Korea exists under such conditions.

Why is it that Christianity is persecuted? The answer lies within the Apostles' answer to the High Priest and council. "We must obey God rather than men." Christians are seen as having a loyalty to God above that of the state. Authoritarian regimes will not tolerate that.

We are so use to our freedom of speech, and within that first amendment right, the freedom of practicing our faith, that we take it for granted. One day however, we may lose that; taken away by a government or other authority that becomes jealous of God. What would we do? How would we act if we were hauled before some tribunal and asked our allegiance? What would we do if we were forbidden to attend a church and receive the sacraments? How would we react if we saw our clergy persecuted, and even executed before our eyes?

There is another aspect to this. One that is insidious by nature, but achieves the same result. We begin with the premise that God is eternal and does not change. God's laws do not change. The same is true of His Son Jesus and His teachings. The Gospel of Christ does not change over time. With that as our starting point, nothing must be left out of the Gospel, or allowed to degenerate through reinterpretation, into a softer version which no longer challenges us, but rather seeks to conform us to the desires of temporal authorities. The whole truth of the Gospel must be proclaimed boldly, and with the same conviction as Peter and the other Apostles.

I believe we live in a time which will require us to testify to our faith in some fashion. A time that will challenge us far beyond what we have experienced thus far. The challenge though may come in an unusual form. Rather than a state forcibly denying our right to worship God openly according to our faith and traditions, the challenge may come to us softly, subtly, in a well packaged, and soothing tone, using words that are pleasant to hear and seem so right for our time, yet changes the principles of our faith to better conform to the world.

When that day comes, may God give us the courage and faith of Peter and the Apostles to testify rightly, and also the necessary discernment to not be beguiled out of the true faith using a soothing version of the Gospel.

Nothing but a Number

Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. Naval officer Grace Hopper became the first female rear admiral of the United States Navy when she was 79. Margaret Haggerty completed her quest to run a marathon on each of the seven continents when she was 84.

If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.

That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.

Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.

In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultra-experienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.

Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?

- What steps can you take this week to build a mutually beneficial relationship with an older adult?
