2024 All Souls Saturdays

The Church always prays for the faithful departed. Certain Saturdays are set aside to commemorate the departed souls and they are called "**Saturdays of the Departed Souls.**" There are five: 3 and 24 February; 2 and 9 March; and 18 May. At Ascension, Divine Liturgy is celebrated on the Sunday immediately following these dates.

The theological basis for these Saturdays is the doctrine that those souls departing are not perfectly cleansed and that the faithful on earth can help them by prayers and almsgiving , and especially by the sacrifice of the Divine Liturgy.

On these Saturdays, Liturgy is celebrated for all the deceased faithful followed by a Panachida prayer service during which time, the names of the departed are read publicly. This venerable custom was transmitted to us by our ancestors as part of our beautiful spiritual heritage.

Each year parishioners give the names of their departed loved ones (Hrrmoty) with the request that they be included at the service for the deceased on the All souls days. In order for your loved ones to be remembered, please provide the names by using the card in your new book of Ascension envelopes, where you will find a 14 January 2023 envelope marked **HROMOTY - 5 ALL SOULS SATURDAYS**. Behind this envelope, you will find an **All Souls "In Memory Of"** card. Enter the names of your deceased loved ones on this card and enclose in envelope and place in the Sunday offering basket.

Our Daily Bread – Walking in Fields of Gold – In Memory of John and Betta

The old fisherman sat on a wooden stool by the red glow of a turf fire. A bowl of barley soup freshly drawn from the pot sat on a side table cooling, along with a good portion of soda bread, and a thick slab of fresh butter. The tea kettle was just beginning to sing. Outside the cottage the wind had built up into a steady moan, with the sound of rain hitting upon the old slate roof. Sure, there was no need to go outside to see what sort of a day it would be. A raw day, cold and wet; a day to stay by the fireside.

Inside the cottage, the room was filled with the earthy smell of the turf fire. An old oil lamp brought a bit more light to the room, enough to make out its contents. An ancient clock, which had been a wedding gift, sounded out the seconds with precision. It had become a companion of sorts since his wife had passed, filling the silence of the room and of his mind. On the walls of the cottage could be made out assorted pictures of family and relatives, along with a yellowing wedding picture and a marriage certificate. This was all interspersed with religious objects and pictures of the saints. There was an open cupboard with a set of well used dishes made distinguishable by their chips and cracks, yet by the cobwebs they had not seen service for many a year. The only books to be found did not rest on a shelf as so many books do. These books were all open and well worn.

The wind outside was increasing now, drowning out the sound of the clock. The distant moan of the wind became a shriek, and the rain had turned to sleet, which pounded the roof and stone walls of the cottage. He murmured, "There will be no parish calls made this day."

Born the second son of a small holding farmer, he was well loved and especially close to his elder brother. The way circumstances were in those days however, he could not hope to inherit much. The farm and holdings went to the eldest, as it was the only way to keep the land intact and viable. So, as so many did back then, he would have to make his own way in the world. His brother had begged him to stay on the farm. But the young man chose another way and hired on as a fisherman, a hard and dangerous occupation. So, he left old Ireland and spent the next 10 years at sea on a trawler working on the Icelandic fishing grounds.

Through the years, the boy became a man, and prospered to a degree. So long he had spent at sea, he would find it difficult to walk on dry land. But come ashore one day he did, and it was on this occasion he met a young girl working in a tea shop. Now he was no great hand at tea, but he gladly gave up his ale in order to be somewhere close to the girl. Lacking confidence though, he could do no more than order tea and scones. For her part she never dared say a word to him, yet always found a way to wait on him, and was ever so attentive anytime he would venture to say a word. This went on for a week and more. It was the land lady of the tea shop that put things aright. Seeing the situation for what it was, she took the girl by the arm and brought her to the table, introduced her to the man, telling him she gets off work in an hour. And with a wave of her hand said the

rest was up to them. And so it was.

That had been many years ago and they were barely separated since that day. They never had much they could call their own. Their treasure was found in each other. He retired from fishing to be near her, and they married as soon as the bans were read. With his brother's help, he secured a plot of land that they would farm. They lived simply, yet with more joy then many a rich lord or fine lady could imagine.

It was the fever you know. It came on quickly and she had died in less than a week. His world was shattered. He wanted to join her but recognized that God had other plans, so he carried on with his work, the best he could. He never returned to the sea, doing what he could to work the land and sustain himself; asking all the while for God's help and for an understanding of it all.

And so the man sat by the fireside, sipping his soup and listening to the storm through the day, and into the night. Sometime during the night, he slipped into a deep sleep and found himself walking in sunshine, across fields of gold, and it was there he met up with his wife.

The next morning broke clear and calm. The parish priest started his rounds early. First on the list was a visit to his old friend the fisherman. He walked into the cottage to find the fire had gone out during the night, and the old man with his head slumped over. He looked on for a while, marveling at the content expression on the man's face. "Well now my friend, your troubles and pain are at an end, you're at home with her now, and heaven the richer for it."

Nothing but a Number

Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. Naval officer Grace Hopper became the first female rear admiral of the United States Navy when she was 79. Margaret Haggerty completed her quest to run a marathon on each of the seven continents when she was 84.

If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.

That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.

Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.

In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultra-experienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.

Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?
