So Dad, which Bible is Best?

Lets see. There are somewhere around 50 different English versions of the Bible out there. There are different translation methodologies for how to render the original Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek into English. Some Bible versions translate as literally (word-for-word) as possible, while some Bible versions translate less literally, in more of a thought-forthought method.

I understand that there are 66 books listed in the Protestant Bible, 73 books in the Catholic Bible, and 79 books in the Greek Orthodox Bible. I honestly never took the time to count. The different count has to do with the number of books in the old testament. There are other doctrinal reasons for the different number of books, reasons which causes some turmoil between Christian scholars. It will not profit you to get into those arguments.

Some translations to me are easier to read then others. The King James version always had a special place in my heart. I guess it has to do with the medieval phraseology. It seems right for me. Others will argue that the King James is one of the hardest to read. Douay Rheims, New Jerusalem, even the New Standard edition will have their proponents and detractors. So which one is best?

Looking around my office I count three bibles; a revised standard version (2<sup>nd</sup> edition Catholic), The Orthodox Study Bible and my old trusty King James version Gideon Bible (pocket edition). This small book fits in the palm of my had. I inscribed it with my name and date way back on 20 May 1970. A short time later I carried it in my sea bag to many different places. On occasion when I was deployed during Christmas, standing a lonely watch, I would take it out and read Luke Chapter 2. There is strength in those words.

Sorry; digressed there. Let's see I have another Bible out in the barn. This has a moleskin binding which makes it easy to search out passages. It also has an excellent glossary of terms so I can find similar passages within scripture. I have another bible out in the pickup also. Oh yes, we have the big family Bible in the living room. We got this

when Mom and I were married. It contains family history going back to the founding of the nation. Added to that, I have several Biblical study books in the library. By each Bible will normally be a pair of reading glasses. Maybe I need to look into getting a large print edition?

I can honestly say I have never read an entire book in the Bible at one sitting. I will read a few verses or a chapter or so at a time, and ponder it. Maybe look it up online and see what commentary has been written about it. The internet has some marvelous tools for bible study. As I have gotten older, I tend to cross reference a chapter or verse with others parts of the Bible. By doing this I have really began to understand more about God, God's purpose for us, and the teachings of Christ.

Please Dad; one last time. Which one is the best!

Oh, the best Bible. That's easy. The best Bible is one that is worn out with use. One that is dog-eared and marked up. One where the spine is damaged from being opened to many times. One where the pages are taped back in place in some fashion to keep everything from coming apart.

A bible that is so well read that you can clearly see the dirty thumb prints of the workman's hand stamped clearly at the bottom of each page as they were holding the Good Book open to read.
