To be a Saint – Saint Luke

Born a gentile in Antioch Syria, he became one of the early followers of Christ, and a close companion to Saint Paul. A physician by trade, an evangelist and missionary by calling. By volume, Saint Luke is responsible for writing over 25% of the New Testament and he was the only gentile whose writings became part of the biblical text. It is within the writings of Luke we first hear the term Christian as referring to the followers of Jesus Christ, Acts, 11:26. To my mind he obtained the most important interviews in the history of the church, including many eye witnesses.

Saint Luke first joined Paul's company at Taros about the year 51 and accompanied him into Macedonia, where they traveled first to Samothrace, Neapolis, and finally Philippi. When Paul continued on in his missionary work, Luke stayed behind to encourage the Church there. Seven years passed before Paul returned to the area on his third missionary journey, where he rejoined Luke in Tros. They traveled together through Miletus, Tyre, Caesarea, to Jerusalem. Luke is the loyal comrade who stays with Paul when he is imprisoned in Rome about the year 61. It was during this timeframe when many scholars believe Luke began to write his gospel, with the Acts composed shortly afterwards.

Luke's inspiration for his Gospel and Acts came from his close association with Paul and his companions, as well as from the Apostles and others who had first hand knowledge of Jesus' life and ministry. He explains in his introduction to the Gospel: *"Since many have undertaken to set down an orderly account of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as they were handed on to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, I too decided, after investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus"* Lk. 1:1-3

Therefore, when we read of the Ascension and the descent of the Holy Spirit, we are hearing about it directly from those present, those who experienced it. When we read of the conversion of Saint Paul along the road to Damascus, we are hearing the story directly from Paul himself, not through tales handed down a long line of tradition.

Luke's Gospel has often been called the gospel to the gentiles. He shared the opinion of Saint Paul concerning the universality of salvation and God's mercy to all men. Luke's unique perspective on Jesus can be seen in the six miracles and eighteen parables not found in the other gospels. He is the one who tells the story of Lazarus and the Rich Man who ignored him. Only in Luke do we hear the story of the Prodigal Son welcomed back by his father. Only in Luke do we hear the story of the forgiven woman disrupting the feast by washing Jesus' feet with her tears. Throughout Luke's gospel, Jesus shows mercy and forgiveness to sinners, His concern for the poor, and His gentle attitude toward women, who in general were treated poorly during those days.

This brings me to a special connection in Luke's Gospel with the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is only in Luke's Gospel that we hear the story of the Annunciation, Mary's visit to Elizabeth, the Presentation of the Christ Child in the Temple, and the story of Jesus' disappearance in Jerusalem, where he is eventually found teaching in the Temple. It is Saint Luke that gives us the tender description of the nativity, using intimate terms that only a mother could have provided. Terms such as wrapping the babe in swaddling clothes and laying in a manger. Consider also the details concerning the presentation and Simeon's prophesy. When Luke writes the words, *"But Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart."* This would not be something a man would be inclined to write. In these words, we hear the clear voice of Mary speaking to Luke; e.g. "I kept all these things, pondering them in my heart." It is Luke that we have to thank for the Scriptural parts of the Hail Mary: "Hail Mary full of grace" spoken at the Annunciation, and "Blessed are you and blessed is the fruit of your womb Jesus" spoken by her cousin Elizabeth.

In Luke we find the discipline of self-denial, Lk. 18:29, and the necessity of taking up your cross daily, Lk. 9:23. These have become fundamental to living a Christian life. The Holy Spirit also plays a large role in Luke's gospel. From the story of the Annunciation and throughout Christ's ministry, the Holy Spirit is mentioned on 20 separate occasions.

Space runs short once again. To rejuvenate your spiritual life and strengthen your faith in the love of Christ, I recommend re-reading the writings of Luke, and sharing them with your family.
