5. Forgive and Forget

Because of Jesus's death on the cross, God forgives our transgressions and chooses to remember them no more. It is the same in our marriage. It is crucial to choose your battles. If you are getting into a battle over every minor annoyance, it may be time to analyze why you're getting so easily agitated. If previous issues have not been dealt with and forgiven properly, they can become relevant in your current squabbles. Ask the Lord to reveal any previous fights or issues you have not forgiven. As Christians, we are called to forgive others seventy times seven. We need to do so in our marriages as well. Forgive past issues and then analyze if the current argument you are embroiled in is worth the fight. More than likely, it's not.

Conflict in any marriage is difficult. But the conflict that has gone unresolved and hearts that have gone unchecked can result in emotional separation, or worse, divorce. Choose your battles and fight the battles that will make you better people in the end. Choose not to make divorce an option. Forgive when necessary, give each other the benefit of the doubt, and best of all give the situation over to the Lord. God wants nothing but the best for your marriage, as it's a reflection of the relationship Christ has with his church. The best way to help our churches regain their voices in society is to be a better example in our marriages.

Our Daily Bread – Changing Seasons On The Farm

These are days of change and anticipation, and there’s a subdued feeling in the air. The days are shorter, the sunlight is different, almost enchanting. It’s no longer the strong, intense summer sunlight, but softer, almost magical. A cooler touch in the morning air, with the promise of the colder temperatures to come. All of these things cause the leaves to show their color. It is called autumn by some, fall by others, and aptly so. Fall is the opposite of spring, when life seems to spring forth, green is its badge. Fall on the other hand sends forth its greetings with a tickertape parade of colors cascading down, but on the whole around here, I’d say its official color this year is shades of brown.

This is a time of flying insects, and a time of spider webs. Birds eagerly feeding on what they can find in the grasses. Sparrows, juncos and a few towhees, along with several more. The blackbirds likewise stay on the ground but prefer to keep to themselves. They come in flocks that cover the sky and ground, wonderful to see taking off or flying overhead. As for the Canadian Geese, they are Canadian in name only. Around here they are permanent residents who like to show off their flying formation skills and hog the road.

The bees are working the purple aster, goldenrod and the yellow cornbread wild flowers. Grasshoppers rule the field, not by strength or wisdom, but by sheer numbers. I have yet to see the wooly bear. I suspect he’ll come along before the end of the month though, with his winter prognostication.

The gardens fit the season, subdued and brown for the most part, with the harvest nearly complete. There is still the late crop of beans to harvest along with late peppers and what green tomatoes I can coax to ripen. Those tomatoes that are reluctant, well they will be harvested and kept in brown paper bags in hopes of having fresh sliced home-grown tomatoes for the Thanksgiving table. Work in the greenhouse picks up. There are the old standbys of lettuce, spinach and kale that provide our winter salads, along with several experiments, most of which will fail, but all of which bring tremendous satisfaction. Parsley, dill, rosemary, oregano and other spices, including peppers, will provide us the spice we need for the table, and the lemons are on track to be harvested in time for Christmas.

The processing barn becomes the place to be. Canning has been on-going for some time, but with cooler temperatures we turn to other things. Bacon needs curing, along with loins and ham. Sausages will be hung soon and the smoker will be busy on most days. A time for making catawba grape jelly and pear jam, using everything the vineyard and orchard produced. Then there is drying herbs and candle making... Well, the work is anything but monotonous. The radio keeps me good company throughout, and I count my blessings.

Changes come in other forms too. In some cases, the change is subtle, in others a bit shocking if not downright comical. I remember when I was of a certain age and started getting solicitations from AARP. They would come once a month or so. I smiled and thought well, it’s part of growing old; I have graduated into a class of senior citizenship. Little did I know that there was another class awaiting me. I don’t receive many AARP solicitations these days, but just last week I received a letter from a memorial institution reminding me that they were there to serve me when that time comes. The letter opened with cheerful words, “How are you doing?” Hoo boy..

So, how am I doing? Well, I’m doing just fine, thank you very much. Counting my blessings every day, and making the most of what gifts I’ve been given.

Parking Lot Replacement Fundraiser - Our parking lot is in a terrible state. There is one section in front of the church hall that is actually leeching dirt from the subsurface during heavy rains. At best that area is a tripping hazard; at worst, continued erosion will one day create a terrible sinkhole. Other sections of the parking lot are so weak that leaf blowers will actually blow away rotten asphalt. We've done sealing repairs twice over the last few years, but that no longer remains a viable option. We need a new parking lot.

The Plan..... Estimates are being gathered, but the simple fact is we do not have the amount of money required to contract the job out. As those numbers come together, we will make it known, but the cost could be in excess of \$75K-\$100K. In the interim, the parish plans to install a professional asphalt repair in the area in front of the hall, where the subsoil is is leeching through. The cost of the repair is something the parish can afford now, while buying us needed time..... In that time Ascension will be conducting a fund raiser to install the new parking lot. Details will be announced soon. Father Alex.
